We have just heard that All Saints has been granted £475,000 from the Big Lottery Fund towards the next phase of our Community Buildings project.

Brian Miles, Project Director says "The grant brings us much closer to our vision of working with our partners and the community to create safe, accessible and attractive facilities at the heart of King's Heath village. The new building will facilitate and

encourage community participation and involvement and will enable a range of new and enhanced provision accessible to the whole community."



Positive Activities for Young People (PAYP)

PAYP programmes provide young people with constructive activities during school holidays. The target group is young people aged 11 to 19yrs (up to 25yrs with a disability) who are deemed to be at risk of involvement in offending and/or anti-social behaviour and those with disabilities and/or who are at risk of being socially excluded.

All Saints Youth Project has been running PAYP programmes for between 50 and 90 young people since their introduction in 2003 and usually run programmes during February, May and October half-term weeks and for 4 weeks during the summer holidays. For more information call Jo Burrows on 441 1827

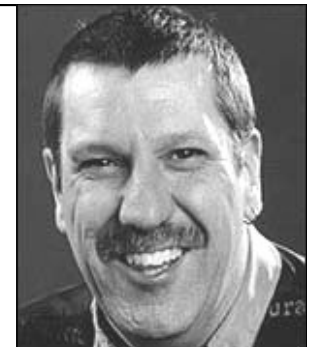
