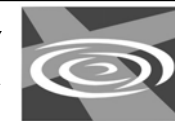

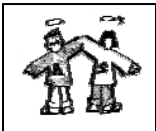
The Church is also open every Saturday morning for individual prayer, tea and coffee.

What is a WOOFYT ?

Well, if you had been in church on Saturday 4th April, you would have discovered what this amazing Heath Robinson-type instrument can do! Jeremy Sampson, of CBSO, has created a one-octave pipe organ from household items , complete with bellows, which can involve 18 people in playing tunes ranging from 'Twinkle twinkle little star' to 'Happy Birthday'. Jeremy ran 2 sessions during the day which were extremely well received. Jeremy also led a children's music games workshop involving making pan pipes from straws and making tunes using bottles.

CBSO musicians Ian Ludford and David Gregory, conducted creative music workshops using a range of percussion instruments, accompanied by Henry Fairs, Organ Scholar at Birmingham Conservatoire, who also supported Jeremy with his WOOFYT. [Wooden One-octave Organ For Young Technologists].

In the afternoon the 'Big Sing' workshop rehearsed in two pieces; 'The Goslings' by Frederick Bridge



followed by an arrangement of Widor's Toccata, whilst a group of young children participated in voice exercises with lots of actions. The two groups came together to perform to each other and the standard achieved was exceptionally high. Thanks to everyone involved.
