VILLAGE SQUARE LATEST

The final design for the new Kings Heath Village Square is now with the City Planning department for discharge of the outstanding planning conditions. This should be complete by Christmas.

Funding from the City towards the construction cost is earmarked for the next financial year and the 2nd stage Big Lottery submission to cover the rest of the cost will be submitted early January.

If all goes well, construction will start next year with a current target completion date of March 2011 and a launch event in the Spring.
