"We were impressed by the level of finish and quality. It looked like it would stand good use over a number of years. It's good to see something like this being done so well in what are remarkably tough times."

As part of ASCDC's Campus redevelopment plan, the Village Square design was conceived and executed by Simon Watkins, RGA Landscape Designer, who worked closely with the ASCDC Steering Group and All Saints Community Arts, to realise a scheme which included significant Artwork inspired by local community groups, facilitated by Community Artist Alison Ogle. The main funders were Big Lottery Community Spaces Birmingham City Council; initial set-up funding came from Kings Heath BID. The Square was opened on 15th October 2011 by The Bishop of Birmingham and the Lord Mayor, and celebrated its First Anniversary last month. The project was also an award Finalist in the category 'Partnership Working'.
