We have opened some welcome space. Joining Church with Medical Centre, Older People's Centre and Hall, it will indeed serve as a space to welcome people for refreshments, enquiries and worship.

Depending how you view it, the building can be described as brick, wood and steel. It is light and space marked out by its lines. It can also be seen as being made of generosity, courage and hope: generosity from the Congregation giving to ensure Community facilities are provided, before attending to their own concern to improve our worship space; courage in those who have begun, handed on and seen through this daring development; hope for all who come to seek health, refreshment, community and wonder.

What a pleasure to welcome John Wilkinson back to share in the opening and representatives from the Big Lottery who helped to fund it. We look forward to welcoming you. David

Construction of the Village Square is well underway

Key features of the scheme :Area; 0.96 acres or 3,884 m2. Hard landscaped areas of block and granite paving, porous resin bound surfacing and blue brick edging including inscribed pavers. Soft landscaped areas comprising lawns and planting; 8 areas of planting. Replacement lime trees (tornado damaged or life expired) plus new trees; total of 28 new trees including 4 yew and 1 Christmas tree. Gravestones carefully lifted and reset in the same locations. Improved location for the war

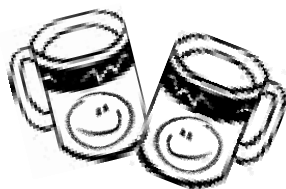
memorial. A labyrinth and threshold feature incorporating community artwork. A low level water jet feature - 7 water jets. Restored Edwardian lamppost. Timber seating (15 benches) and bicycle stands (6 off). Lamp posts and ground level lighting. Performance space and location for markets. "Plaza" for Community cafe. Electrical supplies for events. Interpretation and Community notice boards.

I think it's wonderful to see the Council car park and the graveyard being transformed for Kings Heath. We lose handy parking on Sunday, and I felt the graveyard had a lovely hush about it, but what's coming is a village square for Kings Heath. Relief from the narrow pavements and "crush" elsewhere, somewhere to meet or find quiet next to the church. The sense of hush should still be there, along with large and beautiful trees and even better space for farmers' markets. Crucially, it will make the church and centre more accessible. It's another step on the road to our church reaching out to Kings Heath and serving it. Progress, hopefully!

Ribbon cutting at the new All Saints Centre

May 19th 2011 was an historic occasion in the history of All Saints. Forty people gathered outside the main entrance to be part of the ribbon cutting ceremony that announced the opening of the community facilities of the All Saints site development.

The ceremony was attended by Richard Cottrell, Brian Vermeulen and Francesca Pont from Cottrell & Vermeulen Architecture, representatives from Trengray Builders and the Big Lottery. Canon John Wilkinson (previous vicar of All Saints) spoke about the project's beginnings and The Rev. David Warbrick (present priest in charge of All Saints) spoke about the future. They then cut the ribbon together. Everyone went inside for a celebratory drink and an opportunity to see around the new rooms.

This is a major step in the development as we now have a new community hall, welcome space, room for a new community café and meeting rooms. The current users of the old church hall will be moving into the new centre during half term.

All the spaces are available for local community groups to use and for individuals to hire for weddings, children's parties or other celebrations.

Everyone commented on the light, open space that the rooms give and we look forward to seeing them occupied and busy.
