A new village square for Kings Heath at last! It will see a landscaped area available for events and a new farmers market; it will give a green heart to Kings Heath. It will provide a green area of calm on the busy High Street. The development is being built by builders Trendgrey and will incorporate a labyrinth, water feature and a refurbished war memorial.

What has happened to Pancake Day?

Usually by now we have had Pancake Day, but not this year. So

what's happened to it? This year it doesn't fall until 8th March.

Pancake Day, or Shrove Tuesday is the day before Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent, the period of reflection and fasting that leads up to Good Friday and Easter Day. Easter Day is always on a Sunday, but which Sunday?

The date depends both on the moon and the sun, as Easter is on the Sunday which follows the first full moon after 21st March, or the spring equinox. This means that Easter can fall any time between 22nd March and 25th April. So this year Easter Sunday is just about as late as it can be, and all the other dates dependent on the date of Easter – Pancake Day, Ash Wednesday, Mothering Sunday

and Good Friday are also late.

Mothering Sunday will fall on 3rd April, the first Sunday in April, this year. There will be services at All Saints at 9.15 and 11 am that morning.

In 2038 Easter will fall on the last possible date of 25th April, but it won't fall on the earliest possible date, 22nd March, again until 2285!
