

More Village Square Consultation Results

Results were obtained from 136 completed questionnaires. The analysis of these results reveals that there are some very clear recurring themes that local people would like to see in the new Village Square.

There is a strong sense of community and pride amongst the respondents which came through very strongly regarding the benefits the square will bring to the community.

There were also many requests for entertainment and events within the square such as music and family activities.

The consultation results have been used to help complete the final design which is now with the City Planning Department and Diocese of Birmingham for their approval. *More results on page 2*

Village Square Final Design

The design principles taken forward from the consultation results were:

To retain the existing balance between hard and soft landscape areas To relocate the war memorial to the eastern end of the church To incorporate a low key water feature To include traditional style seating in timber To incorporate colourful planting that is mixed and irregular



The majority of respondents thought that the proposed new location of the war memorial at the eastern end of the church was appropriate

The results also favoured some form of feature within the labyrinth. It is currently proposed to include graphic artwork within some of the labyrinth paving stones. This will be another opportunity to involve the community, as well as a way of adding visual and thematic interest to the labyrinth as a centrepiece of the square.

Because of mixed views about the" open gateway", this feature has been removed from the scheme. However, the design of the corner by the road junction is still based on principles of welcome and invitation, principally realised in the arrangement of new trees to be planted in that part of the square.
