Welcome to our two Neighbourhood Wardens

for Moseley and Kings Heath, Philip Osman (Oz) and Helen Rehman. Their role is to engage with the community to support and encourage people to tackle local environmental problems themselves and to reduce street drinking and begging in the Ward. They are working with residents, local businesses and schools, and organisations. Oz and Helen have already begun advising people about not putting their rubbish

out too early for collection, since it can encourage vermin. Helen and Oz have both been active volunteers in their communities. Oz said that he loved meeting people and this job, for him, was a natural extension of the several years he has already spent as a volunteer resident in Kings Heath, helping to solve problems and issues and making improvements to the local environment. Solar Panels on the roof of All Saints Centre

Nearly two years ago, 17 solar panels were installed on the roof of All Saints Centre. They face south west and so get the afternoon and evening sun. By September 2013, they had produced 4,200 kW hours of electricity, saving over 2 tonnes of carbon dioxide. The Centre benefits from the panels through the lower electricity bills and also from two payments, one called the Feed-in Tariff, which is paid at the rate of 21p per kW hour, and the other from the sale of unused electricity to the National Grid at the rate of 3p per kW hour. By September 2013 this amounted to £927. The funding for the installation of the panels came from loans from All Saints congregation, and so the FiT and export payments are being used to repay the loans. This will probably take about 10 years, and once this is finished there will be an additional income for the Centre!
