

Harvest Sunday October 9th

All Saints celebrates harvest with a service at 10am. We regard this as a thanksgiving service with a hard political edge. I regularly receive calls from people in need, like a woman yesterday whose benefits have been delayed for one reason or another. The Job Centre suggest to them that they call us for help with gas, electricity or food. You can imagine my frustration that, on the one hand we cannot Toothbrushes, Toothpaste, Toilet help wanting to assist someone in that position, but equally, we do not always feel we should underwrite a government's meanness. We do help where we can, often through referrals to our local Foodbanks. We bear the irritation, even anger, when we are told by Ministers not to exaggerate or complain, while it is clearly policy for Job Centre staff to send people to us. We feel for those Job Centre workers who simply want to help the person in front of them. Harvest also has an edgy feel because it brings us up close to environmental concerns and the politics of the commodification of food.

To remember those who grow our food is all the more important in the city where we can easily feel distanced from the earth by layers of plastic packaging.

That is why we encourage friends and neighbours to bring home grown fresh produce the day before which we use to decorate church, then sell after the service raising funds for the Narthex Foodbank at Sparkhill.

We also bring gifts of tinned and dried foods and Shampoo, roll, Feminine hygiene products, all of which the Foodbank distributes with care and respect to people of many different backgrounds. they need about a ton of food a month.

Whether or not you share the Christian faith or care for the Church's way of expressing gratitude for creation, you may share some of these concerns and wish to support those experiencing hardship in our neighbourhood and beyond.

Food gifts can be brought to All Saints in time for Harvest. Of course, all are welcome at the service, too, but we are always humbled to share in humane service with all neighbours of good will, however diverse our beliefs.
