In July All Saints Youth Project said a sad goodbye to Kui Wai Lam as he left Birmingham to move to Sidney, Australia with his wife El and their 3 young children. El is a doctor and wants to gain some experience working abroad for 12 to 18 months before they return to the UK.



Kui has been with the project for 12 years, starting just after he finished university. He has been part-time, full-time, mentoring coordinator and young leaders in the community coordinator. You may well have seen him out and about with a group of young people litter picking (Kui is 3rd from the right in photo), at Highbury Orchard, on graffiti patrol, supporting activities on the village square or at the short date food sessions. Kui was a quiet, patient worker who built relationships through his ability to listen and trust young people.

He also had a creative side and came up with interesting names for activities and events and also invented imaginative games with a purpose.

All Saints Centre The New Normal

All Saints Centre has been closed to the public since the beginning of the lockdown and will remain closed for the foreseeable future. This is because we are unable to guarantee meeting the necessary hygiene standards required to prevent the spreading of the Covid-19 virus.

The most obvious result of this is the closure of the café. We are expecting that the café area will re-open in a different form, which will be run by a new business. Plans are being developed for the re-opening of the All Saints Café in another part of the site some time in the new year.

All Saints Youth Project Still Supporting Young People

Since March ASYP has been supporting young people on-line, telephone including counselling, and through activity packs. This means we have had contact with over 100 young people. We have also offered support to parents. We are very pleased to say that in August we were able to run a summer scheme outside in the back centre car park, in small groups and socially distanced. This has enabled the young people to meet each other and the staff in a safe environment. 15 young people attended in the mornings and 15 in the afternoon for 2 hours over 4 days and 3 weeks. The staff team were very glad to be seeing the young people and the young people were very excited to see each other and to be able to share their experiences and thoughts with everyone.

Due to a small grant from Hall Green Help Micro Fund we were able to provide fruit and personal water bottles. The staff planned a number of activities but the young people were more than happy to talk to each other and play some games and quizzes. They were all very careful about keeping to the rules and could be heard around the site laughing and

enjoying themselves, saying "it's great to be back" and "lovely to see friends again". We are all looking forward to being able to re-open some of our sessions in September and will continue to run our on-line and telephone support. Inclusion+ (our activities for young adults with learning disabilities and additional needs)

Since March we have been contacting our Inclusion+ members on-line, telephone and through visits. We have also offered support to their parents/carers. In August we were able to offer 2 sessions on a Friday, with 2 groups of 10 for 3 weeks. Socially distancing, following guidelines and outside when possible our members enjoyed karaoke, games, bingo, disco but mostly being together again after so long. As one parent said "this has made such a difference to my son". We are exploring how we can reopen our usual Wednesday sessions in September.

During this difficult time the youth project staff have been working hard in very new circumstances, having to learn new skills and develop new ways of working.

Our main aims were to ensure we kept contact with young people, that we listened to how they were feeling and that we offered support.
