#### **All Saints Community Arts Welcome Space Exhibitions**

Since 2012, All Saints Community Arts has curated 47 solo and 9 group exhibitions of work, by predominantly local artists, in the Welcome Space of All Saints Centre, Kings Heath.

These exhibitions were jointly curated by artists Gillian Lever and Janice Rider and subsequently Janice Rider from October 2018 until the present.

Sadly, due to Covid 19, this precious community space is now temporarily closed and therefore our exhibitions are currently and for the foreseeable future suspended.

### Youth Project Summer scheme

For three weeks in August, from the 10<sup>th</sup> to the 27th- All Saints Youth Project welcomed back our family of Young People for a three week Summer Scheme. Over lockdown, the staff have kept a constant and consistent presence on social media, engaging with the Young People through platforms like Facebook, Instagram and even Tik-Tok but all of us have been itching to get back to connecting with the kids face-to-face.

Restrictions and guidelines due to the Covid-19 pandemic have meant that things have

had to change slightly, with restricted numbers, shorter sessions and adapted activities but the one thing that has remained is the positive, fun and friendly atmosphere generated by the staff and young people.

It has been wonderful to see the Young People back, interacting with each other, smiling and enjoying a sense of "normal" after having to endure so much uncertainty and isolation.

One of the young people put it better than any of us adults ever could:

"Coming back has been different, but brilliant.

Seeing my friends, having a laugh- it's just better when we're together and not always online"

Not only has this summer scheme been a welcome boost for the kids who have attended, but it has also given us, the staff team, all of the confidence and



tools required to begin offering sessions and support at the centre again, something that has been ongoing since the 7<sup>th</sup> of September.



Covid-19 may have stopped many things in their tracks for a while, but as the last month has shown, it will take more than that to keep a good thing
